



Adrian Project

On Friday, October 2, 2009, 25 University of Memphis accounting and criminal justice students will become honorary IRS Special Agents for the day. The students will learn what it is like to investigate financial crime and see first-hand if carrying a badge may be their career of choice.

IRS Special Agents from Memphis, Jackson and Nashville will be on hand to serve as coaches and mentors for the “Adrian Project,” an interactive experience that exposes college students to a-day-in-the-life-of-an-IRS-agent, through investigating financial fraud scenarios. The honorary Special Agents will spend the day reviewing financial documents and court records, interviewing witnesses and suspects, conducting surveillance among other unique investigative techniques, executing Search Warrants and testifying before a special grand jury.

University President Shirley Raines, Ph. D, and IRS Special Agent in Charge Christopher Pikelis will be on hand that morning to commission participating students. US Magistrate Judge Diane Vescovo will be present to authorize and sign warrants. US Attorney Larry Laurenzi will conclude the day questioning the honorary Special Agents about their investigative findings before a host of anti-fraud professionals serving as members of a special grand jury.

The University will be a buzz this day as the honorary Special Agents are divided into five teams and embark to various buildings, offices and garages to conduct their investigation. The Law School has volunteered their moot courtroom for the legal aspects of this adventure. WMC-TV5 Andy Wise and other media will be on campus to cover the event. There is no cost to students.
