Wonderful Niagara Falls

Niagara Falls is a massive cascade located on the Niagara River in Western New York and South Eastern Ontario. The Falls are about 12,000 years old. The Falls were given its name by the area's first know inhabitants, the native Indians. They called it "Niagara," which means "thundering sound." The native were the first know inhabitants in the Niagara region. It consists of two waterfalls, which are separated by Goat Island. The larger cascade is the Horseshoe Falls, which is located in Canada. The Horseshoe Falls is 2,600 feet (or 792 m) wide and 173 feet (or 52 m) high. The American Falls, which is located in the state of New York, is 1,060 feet (or 323 m) wide and 182 feet (or 55m) high. The Horseshoe Falls carries 9 times more water than the American Falls, approximately 195,000 cubic feet of water flows over the brink each second .

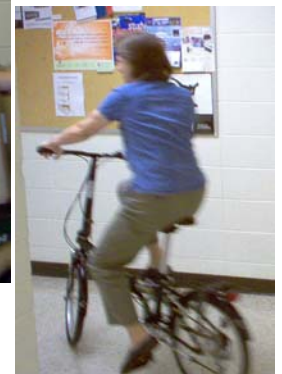
It is the combination of height and water flow that makes Niagara Falls so beautiful. Surprisingly, the Falls have eroded 4 feet (or 1.5m) per year for thousand of years and are the largest producer of hydro-electric power in the world. Particularly the Falls have some very a famous attractions. For example, the Maid of the Mist boat cruise, the Journey Behind the Falls, a casino, a golf tour, and a helicopter tour. The best sightseeing tour of all is "The Maid of the Mist" that is a 20 min. boat cruise, which takes you right into the dense spray of both the American and the Canadian Falls, also known as Horseshoe Falls. 20 million people visit Niagara Falls each year. If you make a trip to the place, I recommend that you had better visit from April to June or September to October because most people visit in July and August. Please make a journey to Niagara Falls, so you will be quite surprised and never forget it. I was there in August 2007. I felt that the place was very exciting and wonderful.
