* Satisfies research requirement for those students having completed three (3) semesters in the full-time program or forty-five (45) semester hours in the part-time program. Papers, in final form, are due no later than the last day of the examination period.

** Students will meet on the 3rd Floor of the Federal Building at 5:30 on Thursdays. All students will need to pass through a screening (similar to the airport) when they enter the building and must have a picture ID. Students must also be in the building no later than 5:30pm. Mr. Discenza will escort the students out after class.

- (a) Enrollment will be limited. Preference will be given according to date of graduation.
 - (b) Prerequisite: Constitutional Law
 - (c) Prerequisite: Secured Transactions
 - (d) Prerequisite: Constitutional Law & Income Tax
 - (e) Prerequisite: Decedents' Estates. Estate & Gift Tax is a prerequisite to Estate Planning.
 - (f) Prerequisite: Income Tax
 - (g) Enrollment will be limited. Preference will be given according to date of graduation of those who have not fulfilled the research requirement.
 - (h) Prerequisite: Constitutional Law and Criminal Procedure I
 - (i) Prerequisites for Legal Clinics are Professional Responsibility and Evidence. Enrollment will be limited.
All Clinics will meet for 7 hours per week at times to be arranged during the first three weeks of the semester for orientation and training.
Prerequisites for Elder Law Clinic - Prof. Responsibility, Evidence, Decedents' Estates
 - (j) Prerequisite: Evidence
 - (k) Enrollment limited. No student enrolled in an Externship may be enrolled in more than 16 hours. Students must have completed 60 hours before enrolling in an Externship. Secured Transactions is a prerequisite for the Bankruptcy Externship.
 - (l) Will not meet regularly through the semester. Class will meet for two or three hours a week early in the semester and for a few hours near the end of the semester. Each section may be divided into smaller sections to aid scheduling. Enrollment is strongly encouraged for anyone who plans to try out for a moot court travel team and for Moot Court board members.
 - (m) Open only to members of Moot Court travel teams. Students will be selected after classes begin. See Kritchevsky for information. You will not be able to register for this class at this time.

Notes:

- Students may only receive credit toward graduation requirements for two Externships or two Clinics or one Externship and one Clinic.
Students may not repeat the same Externship or the same Clinic. A student may not enroll in both a Clinic and Externship in the same semester or summer session, and may not enroll in more than one Clinic or Externship in any semester or summer session.
- Please refer to the Exam Schedule when making course selections. A student may not enroll in courses that have conflicting examination schedules. No exceptions in the Exam Schedule will be made unless written approval is obtained from the Associate Dean **prior to enrolling. Requests must be submitted in writing.**
- Remember that only eight (8) hours of non-class courses can count toward graduation. Non-class courses include Independent Research, Moot Court, Law Review, Advanced Appellate Advocacy, and any Externship.
- Students enrolling in Independent Research I must submit a completed Research Paper Form **before** enrolling. Research Paper Forms are available in the Registrar's Office, Room 201 B.
- **Full-time** students **MUST** enroll in at least 12 semester hours and not more than 18 semester hours. **Part-time** students **MUST** enroll in at least 8 semester hours and not more than 11 semester hours. Students wishing to change programs **MUST** submit a written request to the Associate Dean for approval.
- No student with less than a 2.5 cumulative grade point average may enroll in more than 16 credit hours in a semester unless prior approval is obtained by the Associate Dean.
- Required first year and second year courses **MUST** be taken in sequence as indicated in the Academic Regulations, Sec. 16.1a.
- In addition to our required curriculum, the following elective courses are subjects frequently tested on the Tennessee Bar Examination. These courses will not be offered in the Spring 2010 semester. Preference will be given to December 2009 and May 2010 graduates.
