- (a) Adjunct sections will meet weekly. Class lectures will be held, but not on a weekly basis.
 - (b) Limited enrollment, preference given according to date of graduation. Satisfies Skills requirement.
 - (c) Prerequisite: Business Organizations I.
 - (d) Prerequisite: Gift & Estate Tax.
 - (e) Prerequisite: Income Tax.
 - (f) Prerequisite: Evidence.
 - (g) Prerequisite: Secured Transactions.
 - (h) Prerequisite: Property and Decedents' Estates.

- (i) Prerequisite: Family Law
- (j) Satisfies Advanced Research/Writing requirement for those students having completed three (3) semesters in the full-time program or forty-five (45) semester hours in the part-time program. Papers, in final form, are due no later than the last day of the examination period. Enrollment will be limited, with preference given according to date of graduation to those who have not fulfilled the Advanced Research/Writing requirement.
- (k) Prerequisites for Child and Family Litigation and Civil Litigation Clinics are Professional Responsibility and Evidence.
Prerequisites for Elder Law Clinic are Professional Responsibility, Evidence, & Decedents' Estates.
Prerequisites for Business Clinic are Professional Responsibility & Business Organizations I.
Enrollment will be limited.
All Clinics will meet for 2 hours once a week throughout the semester, as well as 6 hours per week at times to be arranged during the first three weeks of the semester for orientation and training.
Thereafter, students will select two 3 ½ hour time periods per week to spend at the Clinic, at times to be scheduled with the Clinic Director and staff.
- (l) Enrollment limited.
- (m) Prerequisite for the Bankruptcy Externship is Secured Transactions.
- (n) Prerequisite for the NLRB Externship is Labor Law. Students must have already taken Labor Law OR must enroll in Labor Law for the Spring 2010 semester.
- (o) Satisfies Advanced Research/Writing requirement.
- (p) Students enrolling in Externships must have completed 60 credit hours.
- (q) Prerequisite for the Sports Law Seminar is Sports Law.

NOTES:

Students may only receive credit toward graduation for two Externships, or two Clinics, or one Externship and one Clinic.

Students may not repeat the same Externship or the same Clinic. A student may not enroll in both a Clinic and Externship in the same semester or summer session, and may not enroll in more than one Clinic or Externship in any semester or summer session.

No student enrolled in an Externship may be enrolled in more than 16 hours. Students must have completed 60 hours before enrolling in an Externship.

Students enrolling in Independent Research I must submit a completed Research Paper Form **before** enrolling. The form must be signed by the Faculty Supervisor for the Research Paper. Forms may be picked up from the Law School Registrar.

Please refer to the Exam Schedule when making course selections. A student may not enroll in

courses that have conflicting examination schedules. No exceptions in the Exam Schedule will be made unless prior written approval is obtained from the Associate Dean prior to enrolling. **Requests must be submitted in writing.**

No student may take more than eight (8) hours of non-class courses. Non-class courses include Independent Research, Moot Court, Law Review, and any Externship.

Full-time students **MUST** enroll in at least 12 semester hours and not more than 18 semester hours. **Part-time** students **MUST** enroll in at least 8 semester hours and not more than 11 semester hours. Students wishing to change programs **MUST** submit a written request to the Associate Dean for approval.

Required first-year and second-year courses **MUST** be taken in sequence as indicated in the Academic Regulations, Sec. 16.1 a.

No student with less than a 2.5 cumulative grade point average may enroll in more than 16 credit hours in a semester without permission from the Associate Dean.

The following elective courses are subjects frequently tested, in addition to our required curriculum, on the Tennessee Bar Examination. Preference for enrollment will be given to May, August, and December 2010 graduates.
