



Phi Theta Kappa Scholarship

This application places the applicant's name in consideration for the Phi Theta Kappa Scholarship. You will not be considered for any transfer programs if concurrently enrolled at The University of Memphis and a community college or if you are a current University of Memphis student of more than one semester. All scholarships are awarded in the fall for the academic year. Mid-year graduates (Fall graduates) must apply by the deadline below for consideration if funds are available for the Spring semester. Please read the conditions outlined below for scholarship eligibility.

Minimum Requirements for Applicants

- Must be an incoming Phi Theta Kappa member with an Associate's Degree from a community college
- May not receive any other academic scholarships
- Must attend school full time
- Must submit a copy of your PTK Certificate or Membership Card with your application to be considered.

Award Benefit

The award is \$1000 per academic year (\$500 per semester). For a one-year renewal, recipients must maintain a 3.00 cumulative GPA and complete 75 hours per year service requirement.

Application Information

- Award is competitive and the number of awards is based on available funds.
- Completion of all application information is required for consideration.
- All high school transcripts, college transcripts and ACT/SAT scores must be sent to the University of Memphis by the application deadlines listed below for you to be considered for an award

- December 1st for Spring Awards
