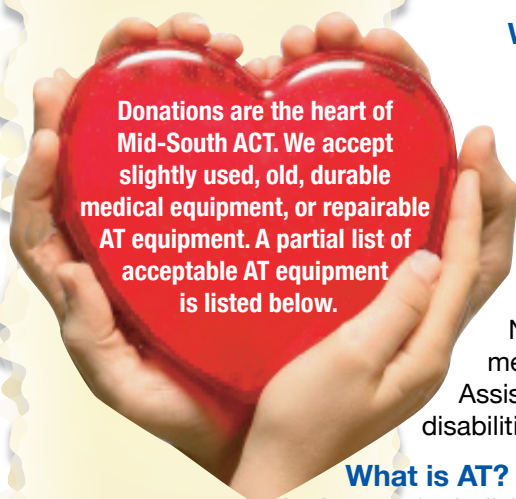

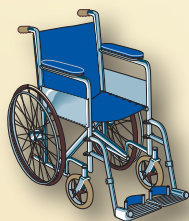
**What is Reutilization?** The goal of Tennessee Technology Access Program's (TTAP) Reutilization is to promote the donation, repair, and reuse of technology and durable medical equipment for individuals with disabilities.

**Why Donate?** Whether for home, work or school, the reutilization program provides equipment so people can be more independent and have a higher quality of life.

**What is Mid-South ACT?** Mid-South Access Center for Technology (ACT) is a non-profit organization partially funded by TTAP. Partnerships include: The National Cristina Foundation, Memphis Center for Independent Living, durable medical equipment vendors, and other non-profit organizations. We provide Assistive Technology (AT) equipment through reutilization to residents who have disabilities in the Mid-South area.

**What is AT?** AT stands for Assistive Technology. According to the Technology-Related Assistance for Individuals with Disabilities Act of 1988, Assistive Technology is "any item, piece of equipment, or product system, whether acquired commercially, modified, or customized, that is used to increase, maintain, or improve functional capabilities of individuals with disabilities." (P.L 100-407)...Amended 2004.
