



Potential College-Related Expenses

The UofM Financial Aid Office develops a Cost of Attendance (COA) for college-related expenses each aid year. The COA is a comprehensive estimate consisting of Direct Costs and Indirect Costs related to educational expenses. Direct Costs can include tuition/fees and a

housing/meal plan if you are living on campus. Direct Costs are only those expenses billed by the UofM. Indirect Costs include books, travel and miscellaneous expenses. Indirect Costs are those college expenses not billed by the UofM.

Here’s what you might expect for an academic year (both fall and spring semesters):

Access and Affordability

TUITION CAP

All full-time, in-state undergraduate students, regardless of the modality of the courses taken (online or traditional), will only be charged for 12 credit hours. There is no additional tuition charge for hours above 12 credits. We encourage 15 hours to graduate in four years. The tuition cap makes it easier to stay on track while maintaining your costs.

Border County Tuition Waiver

Students residing in the following counties may qualify for in-state fees:

- Arkansas – Crittenden
- Mississippi – DeSoto, Marshall, Tunica, Tate

Additional Course Fees

University of Memphis students may be assessed additional fees based on academic programs of study and/or other related course fees. Tuition Transparency Act

In accordance with the Tuition Transparency and Accountability Act passed by the State of Tennessee Legislature, all state colleges and universities shall provide a predictive cost estimate for students applying for undergraduate degree programs.

The University reserves the right to correct errors in student fee assessments and charges which are discovered subsequent to the initial billings or fee statements.

FINANCIAL AID & SCHOLARSHIP OPPORTUNITIES

The University of Memphis selectively awards competitive academic scholarships to entering first-time freshmen. All scholarships are awarded for the academic year (fall and spring semesters only). Scholarships are awarded using information submitted in the admission application.

In order to apply for any federal and/or state aid, you must complete and submit a Free Application for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA). This application is used by the federal government to determine your eligibility for grants and Federal Direct Stafford Loans. Enter the University of Memphis' federal school code of 003509. Entering our code will allow the University to receive a copy of your FAFSA data.
