Lesson Title	Counting with Emeka

#### Lesson Overview

Students will read a counting book then demonstrate counting from 1-10 with math manipulatives. They will compare quantities using more than / less than.

## Suggested Standards

K.CC.A.2, K.CC.B.5, K.CC.C.7, K.CC.C.8

Objectives	Assessment
<ul> <li>Count objects from 1 to 10.</li> <li>Compare quantities using more than / less than.</li> <li>Connect number to real-life objects and cultural elements from Nigeria.</li> </ul>	<ul> <li>Group talk and Recall questions during instruction and reflection</li> <li>Make a list with information in the story as a class</li> </ul>

#### Materials

Physical copy or video read along of Emeka's Gift: An African Counting Story by Ifeoma Onyefulu.

#### Introduction

- Briefly introduce Nigeria, where Emeka's story takes place.
  - Show location on a map
- Read Emeka's Gift, pausing to count the gifts Emeka sees.



Instruction	Activity
<ul> <li>Talk about what kinds of gifts Emeka saw.</li> <li>Write the numbers 1-10 on the board and list the gifts from the story next to them.</li> <li>Ask comparing questions like: <ul> <li>"Were there more brooms or necklaces?"</li> <li>"Which gift came after</li> <li>"?"</li> </ul> </li> </ul>	<ul> <li>Give students counting manipulatives and number cards (1-10).</li> <li>Students work solo or in small groups using manipulatives to replicate the number seen on the card.</li> <li>Optional) Once students are done, have them check each other's work.</li> </ul>

# Reflection

- Ask:
  - o "What was your favorite number or gift in Emeka's story?"
  - o "If you could give a gift to someone special, what would it be and how many?"
