CONSERVATION, CULTURE & ENVIRONMENTAL CHANGE

Spring 2020 2nd session + 10-day Study Abroad to Utila, Bay Islands, Honduras

This 10-day study abroad focuses on the role of the intersection of culture and conservation policy in marine protected areas, with a field-based experience in the Bay Island of Utila, Honduras. Students enrolled in the course will participate in Spring 2020 2nd term course meetings, 3 hours a week for 6 weeks, to read and discuss the anthropological literature on conservation policy, livelihoods and culture change. The course sessions will be followed by a 10-day intensive study abroad program that inclueds a partnership with two conservation organizations: (1) Bay Islands Conservation Association (BICA) and (2) Kanahau Conservation and Research Facility. Students in the course will assist in data collection and analysis for a project funded by the National Geographic.
