What better way for the Hooks Institute to celebrate its 20th anniversary than by developing the personal, social, and academic skills of African American Men at the UofM? While African American male students are tremendously talented and ambitious, they are among the lowest graduating groups at the UofM. The Hooks African American Male Initiative (HAAMI) focuses on increasing their retention and graduation rates through intensive academic, social, and cultural coaching and mentoring.

GROWTH OF THE PROGRAM

Participation in the program is growing by leaps and bounds! Since 2015, the pilot year of HAAMI, enrollment has grown from 10 members to 32 members during the 2016-2017 academic year. For the 2017-2018 academic year, we expect a total of 50 students to enroll in HAAMI!



HOOKS NATIONAL BOOK AWARD WINNER ANNOUNCED!

WE ARE AN AFRICAN PEOPLE: INDEPENDENT EDUCATION, BLACK POWER, AND THE RADICAL IMAGINATION | BY RUSSELL RICKFORD

In the midst of the more well-studied educational changes of the school desegregation era, a handful of "Pan African nationalist" independent black schools emerged as an alternative mechanism for African American uplift. We Are An African People: Independent Education, Black Power, and the Radical Imagination by Russell Rickford examines the ideas and motivations behind these autonomous black institutions and places them within a broader discussion about how best to achieve liberation for the next generation of African Americans. Rickford's work at once expands upon the understanding of a very specific topic within the guest for the intellectual liberation of African Americans and grapples with very broad questions about education, freedom, and the diversity of viewpoints during the civil rights era.
