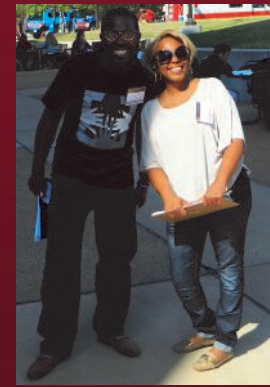
A Giant Step Forward Toward Civic Responsibility

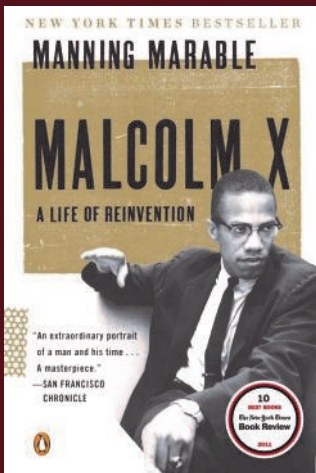

The Hooks Institute will issue a call for Research Proposals to University of Memphis faculty the week of November 26, 2012. Stay tuned for future announcements.

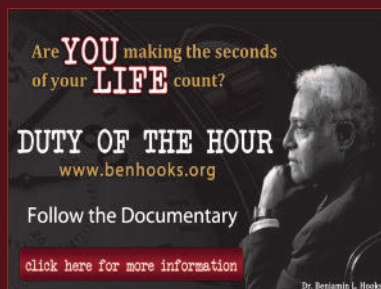
Seeking a Visiting Scholar & a Corporate Fellow
