Departmental Highlights

- Highest Team GPA in the entire department for the year: Women's Volleyball; Highest Team GPA among the men's teams: Men's Tennis. **TEN** teams achieved a 3.0 GPA for the year—Baseball, Women's Cross Country, Women's Golf, Men's Golf, Women's Soccer, Softball, Men's Tennis, Women's Tennis, Women's Track and Volleyball.
- <u>Team GPA highlights:</u> 1) Highest semester GPA's <u>ever</u> in Baseball, Men's Tennis, Women's Softball, Women's Cross Country; 2) 27 consecutive semesters of 3.0: Women's Tennis; 3) 22 consecutive semesters of 3.0: Volleyball; 4) 16 consecutive semesters of 3.0: Women's Soccer.
- 14 of the 17 teams have now posted their highest semester team GPA's in the last 6 years. Seven of those have occurred in the last two years. In addition, as a group, the women's sports posted their highest semester GPA ever with a 3.22 GPA during the fall, 2007.
- 71 student-athletes **GRADUATED** the last academic year, 13 in Aug' 07, 19 in Dec' 07, and 39 in May' 08 (Largest ever for one graduation ceremony).

C-USA Academic Awards

- *Neil Schenk—MBA* was the Memphis nominee and recipient for the **Conference USA Postgraduate Award** in 2007-08. These prestigious \$4000 postgraduate scholarships are awarded to one student-athlete from each conference institution.
- *Brad Benjamin—MGO* was named **Conference USA Scholar Athlete of the Year** for 2008. This award is based on academic and athletic achievement as well as service to the community. Other UM athletes nominated for the Conference USA Scholar Athlete of the Year were:

- 150 student-athletes were named to the C-USA Commissioner's Honor Roll for achieving a 3.00 cumulative GPA or above through the fall semester in a conference sponsored sport. Memphis previously had 144 in 06-07, 152, 126, 103, 109, 106, 112, 101, 115, 98, 55, and 58 in 1995-96.
- 38 student-athletes received the Conference USA Academic Medal. Memphis had the 2nd highest total in the conference for the second straight year. This award is given for achieving a cumulative GPA of 3.75 or higher through the fall semester in a conference sponsored sport. Recent UM medal recipient numbers included 36, 38 (school record) in 05-06, 25, 24, 19, 23, 21, 26, 21, 15, 8, and 11 in 1995-1996.
- The following student-athletes were named to their respective sport's C-USA All-Academic teams during 2007-08. Students must have earned a 3.2 cum GPA and participated in at least 50% of the contests.

• Ten of sixteen UM sports achieved a 3.0 cumulative GPA or higher as submitted for the **2008 C-USA Sport Academic Award.** In fact, 12 of 16 teams earned at least a 2.9 cum GPA. The highest departmental GPA ever (2.785) was also submitted for the **2008 C-USA Institutional Academic Excellence Award**. Volleyball and Women's Cross Country posted the highest team GPA of all Conference USA for 2007-08 and received the **C-USA Sport Academic Award**.

STUDENT-ATHLETE Academic Awards

- FOUR athletes were named to national Academic All-America teams in 2007-08.
 - Kate Murphy—WSO was named 1st Team. Murphy is the second straight women's soccer player to receive national recognition and first-ever 1st team selection. Benedikt Fischer—MTE was the first-ever men's tennis player to receive national recognition with his First Team selection. Brandon Patterson—FB was selected for the first time to the Academic All-American Second team after making 2nd team all-district in 2006. Jared Britcher—MSO was selected for the 2nd time to the Academic All-America Third team.
 - Other Academic All-District IV awardees include: *Robert Sausaman—MSO* was selected to the 1st team all-district for the 2nd consecutive year, *Kylie Hayes —WSO* (3rd Team), *Jake Kasser—FB* (1st Team), *Brandon Pearce—FB* (2nd Team), *Neil Schenk—MBA* (1st Team), *Ashley Liford—VB* (3rd Team), *Lindsay Kelso—WSB* (2nd Team), *Tori Gross—WSB* (3rd Team), *Sivan Aballi—WTI* (1st team-second time), and *Chen Edri—WTI* (2nd Team-second time). <u>12</u> other UM student-athletes were nominated for Academic All-America as these students had been at UM for over one year, had participated in over 50% of athletics contests and had posted a cumulative GPA above 3.25.
- SIX student-athletes were nominated for the **2007-08 NCAA Postgraduate Scholarship.** The NCAA awards a total of 174 postgraduate scholarships. Halley Jo Sullivan—WSO, Jared Britcher—MSO, Adam Montgomery—MSO, Neil Schenk—MBA, Amrit Narasimhan—MTE, and Chen Edri—WTI were nominated for the scholarship. To qualify, student-athletes must have an overall GPA of 3.2 or higher and perform with distinction as a member of the varsity sport.
- Melissa Nance—WSB was nominated as the University of Memphis candidate for NCAA Woman of the Year.
- Eight UM student-athletes received **2008 Arthur Ashe Jr. Sports Scholar Awards**, honoring the contributions made by minority students to their respective institutions as both scholars and as athletes. The student-athletes are: *Jessica Hall—WBB, Brandon Patterson—FB, Brittany Gooch—SB, Tori Gross—SB, Kimmi Hayden--SB, Amrit Narasimhan—MTE, Sivan Aballi—WTK, and Chen Edri—WTK.* The Arthur Ashe Jr. Awards are given each year by Black Issues in Higher Education as a tribute to the legacy of humanitarian and tennis great Arthur Ashe.
- Jake Kasser and Andy Smith were named to the **2008 New Hampshire Honor Society** by the National Football Foundation & College Hall of Fame (NFF). The society is comprised of football players who maintained a 3.2 GPA or better.
- Neil Schenk—MBA, Chen Edri—WTI and Lindsay Kelso--WSB were the 2007-08 recipients of the M-Club Scholar-Athlete of the Year Awards. These awards are given annually to senior athletes for outstanding achievement both on and off the field. These students also held the highest cumulative GPAs of all senior athletes.
- Andrew Hahn and Greg Morton were named to the 2008 Collegiate Rifle Coaches Association All-Academic Honor List. Students must be letter winners who have completed at least 12 hours during the fall semester, enrolled in 12 hours for the spring semester, a fall semester GPA of 3.2 or higher OR a cumulative GPA of 3.2 or higher.
- Sivan Aballi and Steffen Nerdal were recognized by the U.S. Track & Field and Cross Country Coaches Association (USTFCCCA) for their All-Academic team. Students had to achieve a 3.25 cum GPA or higher and had to post an NCAA automatic or provisional qualifying mark in the indoor/outdoor regional championships.
- In addition to the tennis team awards, four men and one woman were nominated as **2008 ITA Scholar-Athletes**. *Benedikt Fischer, Michael Gaerthoeffner, Spencer Heflin, Amrit Narasimhan, and Dara Toulch* were named as ITA Scholar-Athletes. These students have to be a varsity letter winner, achieve a 3.5 GPA or higher for the academic year, and must have spent at least two semesters at Memphis.
- Kimmi Hayden, Tori Gross, Melissa Nance, and Janelle Valle will be recognized as NFCA Scholar-Athletes (National Fastpitch Coaches Association) as they achieved a 3.5 or better average GPA for the 2007-08 academic year. This will be the second consecutive year being recognized for Nance.
- Adam Montgomery was selected to the **2007 NSCAA/addidas Men's Scholar All-America** second team. Montgomery was also named to the All-South Region team along with teammates, Jared Britcher and Robert Sausaman.
- Kate Murphy and Halley Jo Sullivan were honored by the National Soccer Coaches Association of America and named to the 2007 College Women Scholar All-South Region Team.

TEAM Academic Awards

- Men's Tennis was recognized as an **ITA All-Academic Team** for 2008, posting a team GPA of 3.49 for the 2007-08 academic year (3.20 or higher is required for nomination).
- Women's Tennis was recognized as an **ITA All-Academic Team** for 2008, posting a team GPA of 3.24 for the 2007-08 academic year (3.20 or higher is required for nomination).
- Volleyball was named as a recipient of the **2007-08 AVCA Team Academic Award**. The AVCA Team Academic Award honors volleyball teams at the high school and college level that are successful in the classroom. Teams must have a 3.3 Team GPA for the academic year in order to be nominated.
- Women's Golf was nominated for the **NGCA All-Scholar Team GPA Award** for its 3.416 GPA for 2007-08. The award is based on the average GPA for all team members for the year and teams must have earned at least a 3.3 GPA in order to be nominated.
- Women's Soccer earned the **National Soccer Coaches' Association of America (NSCAA) Team Academic Award**. The team was recognized for a team cum GPA above 3.0 for 2007-08.

GRADUATION RATES

• 52 student-athletes exhausted their eligibility in 2008, 34 of whom have already graduated. For each class, those students who participated as **seniors** (exhausted their NCAA eligibility) are tracked for graduation purposes, including scholarship and non-scholarship students. The previous senior classes and their graduation rates are listed below. This particular data is a UM statistic only and is not formally reported to NCAA.
