SWOT Survey (July)

Quantitative historical data

- Students majoring in humanities, natural sciences, and social sciences represent 4.0%, 8.2%, and 10.5% (totalling 22.6%) of UofM students
- One year retention among majors in humanities, natural sciences, and social sciences has been +3.5%, +2.0%, and -3.4% compared to the UofM average
- CAS federal and non-federal research awards are 37% and 52% of UofM total

Phase II – Opportunities to Engage
