### **ASO DEVELOPMENTAL SCREENINGS**

On-site training in the administration of the ASQ-3 and ASQ S/E to assess how children are doing in important areas such as speech, physical ability, social skills, and problem-solving skills. Can help identify child's strengths as well as areas in which child may need support. Teachers will also learn how to implement classroom activities that support social/emotional development.
