

Accomplishments 2022-2023

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College of Education

- Degrees Awarded
 - The COE awarded 380 degrees in 2021-22
- Research Activity
 - 54 proposals awarded over the last 3 years totaling nearly \$14 million
 - Significant awards for the last year
 - 2022-2023 YTD @ >/ = \$250,000 = 4
 - One submission over this amount is pending the final award
- Credit Hours Generated
 - In 2021-22, the COE generated a total of 21,335 credit hours
- Enrollment on-ground and on-line
 - In fall 2022, the COE enrolled 1,372 students

Accomplishments 2022-2023



- Earned national accreditation from the Council for the Accreditation of Educator Preparation
- Received a rating of exceeds expectations on the TN Teacher Prep Report Card in the areas of Candidate Profile and Employment and successfully met expectations in Candidate Assessment
- Named by the TN Department of Education as a Grow Your Own Teacher Apprentice Center and was awarded a \$600K+ subaward
- EDPR and HIAD program reviews
- Partnered with College of Engineering, CAS and Office of R&I to provide a research innovation series and small cohort research development series
- Ranked #1 in TN for Best Online Education (USNWR)
- Rehabilitation Counseling Program ranks 20th in the nation (USNWR)
- The ABA program has secured over \$4M in grant/contract funding and provided services to over 500 families and children over the past 3 years. The ABA Clinic has brought in \$60K in revenue since 2022.

 - Enhance the work of the undergraduate and graduate COE recruitment and retention committees
 - Strengthen ongoing support for teacher licensure examination preparation
 - Enhance program offerings for the Lambuth Campus with a focus on retention, recruitment and completion



3% Budget Reduction Plan

 - Undistributed salary budgets
 - Online budgets
 - Operating budget
 - Summer instruction budget

Challenges

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- Salary compression
- Competitive salaries for faculty and staff
- Increased support needed to build capacity for Office of Sponsored Programs and Grants Accounting to develop a robust and sustainable infrastructure for research
- Teacher workforce/pipeline
- Enrollment caps instituted in HIAD doctoral program due to limited full-time faculty and excessively high doctoral advising loads

- Continued emphasis on supporting the University's efforts to maintain Carnegie I status
- Strengthen coordination and strategic efforts across departments for enhanced student engagement, retention and completion
- Continue to increase student fellowships and scholarship support

- Continue to increase support for Faculty Research
