





Office of Teacher Education and Clinical Practice

- Academic Advising for 4 Undergraduate Programs within College of Education
- Works with all Teacher Licensure in all areas of education which include:
 - Master/Graduate Students
 - Physical Education Undergraduate Licensure (K-12)
 - English as a Second Language (ESL) Licensure (K-12)
 - Art Education Licensure (K-12)
 - Music Education Licensure (K-12)
- Oversees and works with all teacher placements for practicum, internships, and outside classwork.
- As part of your Masters or Undergraduate Degree program that includes a licensure component, you must apply to admission into the TEP by the end of sophomore/second year.



Teacher Education Program (TEP) Admissions

- To be provisionally admitted into TEP, an undergraduate candidate must:
 - submit an application,
 - have a 2.75 cumulative undergraduate GPA,
 - have completed at least 45 hours before applying for provisional admission.
 - Among those hours the following courses must be passed:
 - ENGL 1010, ENGL 1020, MATH 1420 or equivalent, and EDPR 2111 for Teaching All Learners and Human Development and Learning majors;
 - ENGL 1010, ENGL 1020, MATH 1530 or equivalent, and EDPR 3302 for Integrative Studies Secondary Math majors,
 - must pass all portions of the PRAXIS Core Academic Skills Test for Educators (CORE)
 unless the candidate has an Enhanced ACT score of 21 or above or a combined score
 of 1020 or above on the SAT.
 - Note: passing the CORE writing exam is a non-negotiable and can not be appealed
 - have a cleared TBI background check on file in the Office of Teacher Education.
