Short Course Description: English 4430 Fall 2016

We will study the exciting new literary and artistic genre of the graphic or comic book novel. Since the graphic novel is an international phenomenon, we will look at outstanding works by creators in Brazil, Canada, France, Russia, Japan and the UK as well as the US. Students will emerge with a formal understanding of the new genre, with knowledge of its development in several countries, and with an ability to analyze and write about the specific literary and visual features of outstanding examples. Students will also be able to discuss the biographies and historical circumstances of some of the most important creators of the graphic novel; demonstrate a thorough understanding of at least one work by each; and demonstrate an understanding of the graphic novel as a new literary genre.
