VOCABULARY QUIZ

University of Memphis Language Fair 2019

GUIDELINES

- Only **three** students per class may participate in the same vocabulary quiz.
- Students may only compete in ONE vocabulary quiz, which must correspond to the level and language in which they are currently enrolled.
- Only foreign language students who are not native speakers or speakers of a cognate language may
 participate in this event. Native and heritage speakers and speakers of the language or any cognate
 languages may NOT participate.
 - Native and heritage speakers are defined as students who have been raised speaking the target language, or who have had one or more years of study in a school in which the working language is the same as that of the target language.
 - Cognate languages are ones that closely related to the language being tested, such as
 Portuguese speakers in Spanish contests. Speakers of cognate languages are excluded from
 the vocabulary quiz in the name of fairness and may not participate in this event.

FORMAT

- Students will assemble in a room furnished with tables or desks and will be provided with a pencil and a copy of the quiz.
- The guiz will consist of the following at each level [I, II, III, and IV]:
 - 1. 50* words in the target language that are to be translated into English
 - 2. 25* words in English that are to be translated into the target language
 - 3. A short dictation in the target language (except for Chinese, Japanese, and Latin) to be written in the target language. In the case of Latin there is a short sight translation into English, not a dictation.
 - *Amount of words may vary depending on the language
- Vocabulary items will be appropriate to the level of the students and will be drawn from basic vocabulary lists. We realize that not all students will be familiar with the same vocabulary.
- Dictations will be read twice. Requests by students to repeat any part of the dictation will not be granted.
- Students have 20 minutes to complete the test; if they finish early, they must remain in their seat in
 order to not disturb the other students. When 20 minutes have elapsed, students will be told to "stop
 writing" and put down their pencils. Any students not adhering to this rule will be eliminated from the
 competition.
- The format of the vocabulary quiz may vary slightly from language to language.

JUDGING

- ALL mistakes (i.e., incorrect translations and incorrectly spelled words or written characters in the target language and English) will cause an answer to be considered incorrect. In French, German, and Spanish, students must provide the appropriate DEFINITE ARTICLE when giving a noun in the target language (e.g., book in French is le livre). In the case of Arabic, Japanese, and Chinese, the correct production of characters will be judged more critically.
- In the event of a tie, the student with fewer mistakes on the dictation (sight translation for Latin or the writing of characters for Arabic, Chinese, and Japanese) will be declared the winner.
