University of Memphis Language Fair 2020

GUIDELINES

- Students will design a poster for display and judging at the Fair under the theme for this year's Fair. The maximum size for posters is 2 feet by 3 feet. If the poster does not adhere to the theme, it will not be judged.
- The poster should reflect the theme of this year's Fair but need not incorporate it word for word. Any writing on the posters must be in the target language.
- Affixed to the lower right front corner of each poster must be a 3x5 card with the following information:
 - Category: <u>POSTER</u>
 - Language
 - School
 - Name of student(s)
 - o Name of teacher
- Maximum of two entries per class and maximum of two competitors per poster.
- Foreign language students, native/heritage speakers, and speakers of cognate languages are welcome to participate in this event.
- All display events (Art, Crafts, Greeting Cards, Posters, and Research Projects) must be in the appropriate room (organized by language) by 8:45 a.m. on the day of the Fair. They must also be retrieved from the rooms where they are displayed by 2:00 p.m. or they will be thrown away.
