

# POETRY WRITING – HERITAGE / NATIVE SPEAKERS

## University of Memphis Language Fair 2022

### **i** GUIDELINES

- Students will submit an original work of poetry in the target language to be judged prior to the day of the Fair. There is no length restriction for the poems.
- All work must be done solely by the student.
- The use of dictionaries is permitted, though online translation is not.
- All entries must be uploaded in the online Registration Entry form before it is submitted. Each level must be submitted as a separate Word or PDF document. All entries for that level must be submitted in the same document.
- Submissions will be accepted starting February 1<sup>st</sup> and will close on March 11<sup>th</sup>. All work is to be submitted to [memphis.edu/fair/](http://memphis.edu/fair/).
- Poems that have won prizes in previous years may not be re-submitted.
- Only native and heritage speakers and speakers of the language or any cognate languages may participate.
  - **Native and heritage speakers** are defined as students who have been raised speaking the target language, or who have had one or more years of study in a school in which the working language is the same as that of the target language.
  - **Cognate languages** are ones that closely related to the language being tested, such as Portuguese speakers in Spanish contests. Speakers of cognate languages are excluded in the name of fairness and may not participate in this event.

| Language Task    | Communication is satisfactory. | Language Control | There is <b>satisfactory control</b> of level-appropriate grammar. English sentence structures might be used.                | There is <b>minimal or no control</b> of level-appropriate grammar with frequent mistakes. Mistakes generally obscure meaning. English sentence structures are frequently used. |
