## **University of Memphis Language Fair 2022**

## GUIDELINES

- Students will need to create a website using Google Sites. The website should then be published after completion. It needs to be relevant to the language spoken, and it must be appropriate. The website should also be informative, containing relevant information based around the theme of the language fair.
- Students will submit a project based on countries and/or cultures in the target language. Projects must display
  effort on the part of students to present research on, and an understanding of, some aspect of a foreign country or
  culture
- Submissions will be accepted starting February 1<sup>st</sup> and will close on March 11<sup>th</sup>. All work is to be submitted to memphis.edu/fair/.
  - Each word document must have the following information:
    - Students' Names
    - o School
    - Teacher
    - Language
    - Level (I, II, III, or IV)
- Projects should not exceed more than 3 total tabs on each web page.
- Projects that have won prizes in previous years may not be re-submitted.
- Maximum of two entries per class period and two students per project.
- Foreign language students, native/heritage speakers, and speakers of cognate languages are welcome to
  participate in this event. Sites developed by heritage/native speakers will be judged separate from websites
  developed by foreign language speakers.
