# Language Fair 2026 Mini-Research Project: CLASSICAL ITALY TODAY

Explore how ancient Rome or other Italian cities/places are rooted in Classical Culture and still influence modern Italy!

You can create a Powerpoint, poster, or present in any other format that you prefer in your video.

Videos that were entered in previous years may not be re-submitted.



# Suggested topics:

- 1. Architecture: Roman engineering and its influence on Italian cityscapes (e.g., arches, domes, aqueducts).
- 2. Art and sculpture: Classical styles reflected in Italian art, such as Renaissance painters or Neoclassical sculpture.
- 3. Religion / Mythology: the use of classical myths and symbols in Italian art and culture (e.g., the myth of Daphne and Bernini's sculpture of 1622, see image Galleria Borghese).
- 4. Public spaces: Roman forums and their influence on modern Italian piazzas.
- 5. Entertainment: the legacy of Roman theater and gladiatorial games in Italian festivals or events.
- 6. Calendar and festivals: Roman festivals that evolved into modern Italian holidays (e.g., Ferragosto < Feriae Augusti)
- 7. Cuisine and daily life: foods, customs, or household items with roots in Roman culture.

# Research guidelines:

- **Focus**: investigate the origins of your topic in Classical Roman culture and explain how it continues to influence Modern Italian life.
- **Sources**: use at least two reliable sources, such as museum websites, documentaries, or academic articles.

• Visuals: include images, artifacts, or examples in your presentation to support your points.

# **Presentation Outline:**

- 1. **Introduction (30 seconds)**: briefly introduce your topic and its connection to Classical Rome / Roman times.
- 2. **Classical origins (1-2 minutes)**: explain the topic's origin in ancient times, including key figures, events, or sources.
- 3. **Modern Italian influence (1-2 minutes)**: describe how this Classical element is visible today in Italy, with specific examples or locations.
- 4. **Visuals**: include a photo, video, or artifact to illustrate your topic (e.g., a Roman structure compared to a modern one).
- 5. **Conclusion**: summarize the impact of Classical culture on Modern Italy and why it remains significant.

# **Presentation format:**

- **Time limit**: 3-5 minutes to keep your presentation focused.
- **Visual aids**: choose a format that enhances your presentation, such as a poster, slides, or handouts.

# **Evaluation criteria:**

- 1. **Content accuracy**: thorough research on classical origins and modern connections.
- 2. **Relevance**: a clear link between classical culture and contemporary Italy.
- 3. **Visuals**: effective use of images or artifacts to support your points.
- 4. **Clarity and engagement**: clear delivery and engaging presentation style within the time limit.
- 5. **Originality**: creative and insightful exploration of your topic.

# Roman public spaces

- 1. Introduction: introduce the Roman Forum and its role as a center of public life.
- 2. **Classical origins**: describe how forums were used for politics, commerce, and community events in ancient Rome.
- 3. **Modern Italian influence**: explain how Piazza del Campidoglio in Rome, designed by Michelangelo, reflects the influence of Roman forums in its layout and civic function.
- 4. **Visuals**: show an image of the Roman forum alongside piazza del Campidoglio, highlighting similarities and/or differences in purpose and architectural features.
- 5. **Conclusion**: emphasize the enduring influence of Roman urban planning on Italian public spaces.
