## **April is Distracted Driving Awareness Month**

In our fast-paced lives, we often multitask, even while driving. However, it's essential to recognize that distracted driving can be dangerous for us, our passengers and other drivers on the road. Let's take a moment to understand what constitutes distracted driving and explore ways to ensure our safety on the road.

Distracted driving defined as any activity that takes your attention away from driving. This includes texting or talking on the phone, eating, adjusting the radio and even daydreaming. It is important to remember that even a momentary lapse in attention can have devastating consequences.

If you are the driver, follow these steps for a safe drive:

- If you are expecting a text message or need to send one, pull over and park your car in a safe location.
- Ask your passenger to be your "designated texter." Allow them access to your phone to respond to calls or messages.
- Do not engage in social media scrolling or messaging while driving.
- Cell phone use is habit-forming. Are you struggling to text and drive? Activate your phone's "Do Not Disturb" feature, silence notifications or put your phone in your vehicle's trunk, glove box or back seat until you arrive at your destination.

Drive safely.

This message is part of the Distracted Driving initiative, supported by the THSO (Tennessee Highway Safety Office) through a grant of \$168,143.97. The grant was awarded to the MSCM research team comprising Dr. Subhash Jha (P.I.), Dr. Susana Jaramillo (Co-P.I.) and Casey Waldsmith (Doctoral Candidate). The team aims to study the impact of message framing on young drivers' attitudes and behaviors. They plan to use advanced eyetracking technology to gain insights into the perceptions of distracted driving in Shelby County and the effect of distracted driving advertisements on young drivers. Ultimately, the goal is to reduce distracted driving behavior in the area and make a meaningful contribution to the field of motivation and persuasion.
