- Management Information Systems (MIS) is the application of information technologies, including computers
 and communications networks, to business, with emphasis on management of the entire information systems
 function.

- The content areas include systems analysis and design, database management, telecommunications and networks, client-side and server-side computer programming, and the management of information systems.

CAREER OPPORTUNITIES

- The U.S. Department of Labor consistently lists systems analysis and programming as among the top ten fastest-growing fields.
- Job categories include systems analysis and design, programming, database administration, network administration, web site design and development, and consulting.
- Virtually every type of business is dependent on information systems, so career opportunities are expected to increase in the future.
- MIS personnel are increasingly being called upon to help reengineer how businesses work to take full advantage of information systems capabilities.
