The Finance Profession has several unique certifications including the Certified Financial Planner (CFP) and Chartered Financial Analyst (CFA) which have important professional and societal significance.

CAREER OPPORTUNITIES

A wide range of opportunities exists for financial analysts, budget analysts, loan officers, stockbrokers, portfolio managers, investment brokers and other financial advisors. According to U.S. government sources, employment in many finance areas are expected to grow faster than average in the future.

Many scholarship opportunities are available for qualified students majoring in finance with a concentration in business finance. Internships are available in industrial corporations, banks, thrift institutions and securities firms. **A maximum of 3 credit hours of internship may be used in the major.**
