Graduate Internships 2008-09

What is a graduate internship?

Work 6 hours a week (supervised) during the term in a history-related capacity using your knowledge and skills.

Do I have to be a graduate student in History?

Yes.

How long does it last?

One-term—Openings available for Fall 2008 or for Spring 2009.

How much credit can I earn?

Each internship will earn 1 hour graduate credit, and you can take up to 3 internships during your graduate career.

Where will I work?

The Department will negotiate a placement with an appropriate institution.
