Apply to the Honors College as a Transfer Student

- The Honors College accepts transfer students who have a 3.25+ college GPA and less than 60 earned credit hours
- Honors credits from previous institution(s) with an earned grade of “B” or higher are accepted toward program requirements
- We must be able to determine honors credits on official transcript from previous institution(s)
- Honors experiences completed at previous institutions may count toward Honors College requirements
- Students with over 60 earned credits may apply to the Honors College and be considered if they earned honors credit or participated in an honors experience(s) at previous institution(s)

Graduate with “University Honors”

- **25 credit hours of honors courses**, earning a **B or higher** in all honors courses
- Honors Forum - UNHP 1100 (transfer students can substitute with another honors course)
- Two Honors Experiences
- A **3.25 GPA or higher** (overall and UofM) at the time of graduation

Approved Honors Experiences

- Upper-Level Honors Course
- Graduate Level Course
- Study Abroad for College Credit
 - One-Time Only
 - Also counts as 3-honors credits
- Internship for Academic Credit
 - One-Time Only
 - Also counts as 3-honors credits
- National Student Exchange (NSE)
 - One-Time Only
 - Also counts as 3-honors credits

- “University Honors” graduation distinction (will appear on diploma and transcript)
