The general aim of this English for Specific Purposes (ESP) course is to help students to develop as writers within the business or academic community by raising awareness of, practicing and reflecting upon the conventions of written texts in English. During the course, students will:

- Improve critical reading skills, enabling students to think and write more clearly and incisively
- Identify the structural features of specific writing genres, relevant to business, academic or other individual purposes
- Refine writing processes through generating ideas, drafting, peer evaluation and individual writing consultations
- Learn to take into consideration the expectations of one's readership with regard to writing discourse
- Effectively use the work of others in writing, including use of sources and citation methods
- Expand and improve the students' ability to work independently by exploring new strategies for learning

The general aim of this English for Specific Purposes (ESP) course is to help learners achieve individual professional communicative goals. During the course, students will be exposed to:

- The nature, purpose and characteristics of professional conversation
- Phonological forms to use in speech
- Developing conversation skills with a sense of stress, intonation and meaning
- Starting, maintaining and finishing conversations
- Standard conversational exchange
- Spoken language idioms, as well as business/academic metaphor
- Effective listening and attention to others
- Gestures and body language
- Do's and Don'ts in professional conversation
- Telephonic conversation
- Functions of English in conversation: introductions, greetings, clarifications, explanations, interruptions, opinions,
- Agreement and disagreement, complaints, apologies
- Participating in informal discussions and situations
- Using information to make some decision, i.e., making arrangements with colleagues
- Reproducing information in some form (guestion/answer, summarizing, oral reporting, etc.)
