Information for applicants already in Memphis - NOT for F1 (student) visa applicants

The following materials must be submitted to the IEI office on the main UM campus when applying:

- Completed, signed Community Courses at Collierville Application Form
- Application fee (\$25; non-refundable)

All fees must be paid by the final day of registration posted on the IEI web site. Applications may be submitted in person, by email, by fax or by mail. Payment may be made by check, money order, credit card or cash. Checks or money orders may be mailed, but please do not mail cash. **Do not send credit card information directly to the IEI office**. If you wish to pay by credit card, come in person to the IEI office on the main UM campus or contact us by phone or email for instructions.

Please be aware that classes will be cancelled the Friday before the first class if there have not been enough students to register. You will be informed by phone or by email if this happens and you will be refunded for your tuition.

Reading and Writing for Internationals 9:30 am - 11:00 am, Mondays and Wednesdays February 8 - April 20 (No Classes March 7 and 9 - Spring Break) \$310

The general aim of this course is to help students to develop reading and writing skills by raising awareness of, practicing and reflecting upon the conventions of written texts in English. During the course, students will:

- Read for main points and specific information
- Answer comprehension questions on a text
- Make inferences from written texts
- Identify different text types (narrative, news report, informational text etc.)
- Use text types as models for different types of writing
- · Write biographies and narratives
- Write descriptions of events and achievements
- Write formal letters and other types of messages
- Give opinions and supporting reasons in essays and reviews
- Take notes when listening to information

Listening and Speaking for Internationals 11:15 am – 12:45 pm, Mondays and Wednesdays February 8 – April 20 (No Classes March 7 and 9 - Spring Break) \$310

The general aim of this course is to help learners achieve individual communicative goals. During the course, students will:

- · Listen for main ideas and supporting detail
- Use listening as a basis for presenting information
- · Listen in order to make notes
- · Listen in order to summarize verbally
- · Listen for explanations and reasons
- Talk about a wide variety of topics
- Present information clearly to others
- Describe events and achievements
- Explain opinions and decisions
- Speak accurately in various contexts

Text: Pronouncing American English: Sounds Stress and Intonation, 3rd Edition by Gertrude F. Orion

The general aim of this course is to help learners achieve the pronunciation goal of speaking in a clear and understandable way. During the course, students will:

- · Practice sounds the student struggles with in the classroom together, individually and in the real world
- Use the varying lengths that vowels and consonants can require
- Identify key words for stress and understand how word stress and intonation affect meaning
- Practice proper pausing, word stress, phrasal stress, and intonation skills
