# University District Community Transportation Plan

Faculty and students from the Department of Civil Engineering and the Division of City and Regional Planning are working with the University, local business owners, and the Urban Land Institute on a community wide plan to develop a multimodal transportation system focusing on enhanced walkability, bikeability and transit solutions for the area around the UofM campus.

## **Vessel Trip Collection Using AIS**

Our research partners at Vanderbilt University recently completed a project investigating the feasibility of using Automatic Identification System (AIS) technology for use in producing more detailed trip data on the inland waterway system. The Vanderbilt researchers developed custom software and GIS routines to decode the binary message data and convert it to useful information on trips in the Paducah area. Challenges of this work included processing the large amount of data (more than 158 million messages) and the geography of the Paducah area; which is where the Ohio, Tennessee and Cumberland Rivers meet.
