It's fall and we are officially in full swing preparing for our LMS transition to Canvas. Courses have begun to migrate into Canvas. All Spring 2021 courses with data have been imported in Canvas, and Fall 2020 is on schedule. All courses from the past two years (Spring 2020 – Fall 2021) have now been copied from D2L and are ready to be transmitted to and imported into Canvas. Once all courses are migrated, faculty will receive an email from UM3D. It is recommended that faculty make any needed changes to course content in Canvas and not eCourseware.

The last three years of courses are being archived to remain compliant with SACS (Southern Association of Colleges and Schools) and THEC (Tennessee Higher Education Commission) to keep UofM records on file.

umApps

Using umApps from Off-campus.

Before using umApps on or off-campus, you will need to install the VPN (Virtual Private Network). umApps provides easy, web-based access to a variety of specialized applications such as SPSS, Mathematica, Microsoft Word, and many more. See our page for installation instructions and documentation. After connecting to the VPN, you may notice an additional security featured - SSO (Single Sign On). You will now, also, use DUO to authenticate. University students and faculty can access the software from any PC or Mac, on and off campus. Need to save a file? Use OneDrive to store that file you created via umApps. As a member of the UofM community, you have access to Adobe Acrobat DC and Adobe Creative Cloud. NOTE: When using Adobe Products, you will be asked to sign in using your UofM email and credentials. An Adobe agreement provides the University agreement with Adobe Acrobat DC and Creative Cloud.

MFA (Multi-Factor Authentication for Citrix) for umApps/ Citrix – DUO was implemented for umApps/Citrix June 2021. SSO (*Single Sign-on*) implementation is scheduled 12/31/2021.

Role / Access Termination Schedule Staff - Immediately following the last day of employment.

Full-Time Faculty - 365 days following last date of employment.

Special access will need a Service Request prior to access termination.

NIST 800-171 Compliance – CIU (Controlled Unclassified Information) in Non-Federal Information Systems and organizations needs to be in compliance. CIU is information that the federal government does not consider classified, but needs to be protected. A system security plan is required for sponsored projects that handle CUI. In addition to annual Security Awareness training, DoD (Department of Defense) training will be required for any sponsored research team members. Once DoD training is completed, team members will be emailed a certificate.

- **1) Encryption of Data –** Encrypting desktops making data harder to steal.
- **2) Advanced threat protection –** High powered antivirus installed.
- **3) Removal of Administrative Rights –** The removal of administrative rights to be replaced with standard user rights. This will pertain to devices purchased by the University. The team is currently exploring an option that allows desktop users to request admin rights when necessary. **Note:** This is only for University-owned devices.

Dell Punchout Standardization – Who said standards are overrated? The Desktop team is working with Procurement to standardize the computer buying selection in the Dell Punchout located in TigerBuy. You will see the standard configuration for the UofM. The system will show availability of equipment. This applies mainly to computers and not peripherals.
