### OVERALL, RULES AND REGULATIONS

The following rules, events, and activities were developed by the 2023 Homecoming Committee. Please read all rules and regulations carefully prior to Homecoming events/activities to avoid any misunderstanding, incorrect interpretation, and possible disqualification from the homecoming events. All registered student organizations, residence halls, University Departments, and all students are invited and encouraged to participate in Homecoming 2023! Teams may be comprised of up to **TWO** organizations.

All official homecoming entry forms must be completed on TigerZone no later than 12:00pm on Friday, October 20th, 2023.

Groups and organizations working together **must** note their partnership on the official entry forms. Groups and organizations must complete official entry forms individually and must all acknowledge the partnership on entry forms. If an organization is partnered with another organization, they **must** enter every competition as partners.

All times and deadlines are strictly enforced. Refer to individual event rules and regulations for deadline information.

Since The University of Memphis is a dry campus, we strictly enforce the "NO alcohol" policy at all events and competitions. Organizations caught drinking or carrying alcoholic beverages during the Homecoming events will be disqualified from the event and may be disqualified from Homecoming competitions. Further action may be taken however the Homecoming Committee sees fit.

Individuals or organizations who fail to adhere to the general rules and regulations must meet with the Senior Coordinator of Student Services.

Winners from each event and category will be announced on Friday, November 3, 2023.

Please keep in mind that the whole purpose of Homecoming is to support the Tigers and encourage school spirit! The focus is to make Homecoming fun and an occasion to bring the school together. Each competition is separate. Participants may choose which competitions they participate in. Participation in one competition will not affect participation in other competitions, but all points earned will be accumulated to determine an overall winner. Therefore, the more a team participates, the higher the likelihood that they will be crowned the Homecoming champions! All University of Memphis students are encouraged and welcome to participate in all Homecoming events!

#### PAINT THE DOORS, ROW, AND HALLS BLUE

Judging will begin on social media on Monday, October 30th starting at NOON

(Instagram, uml\_ss & FB, University of Memphis Lambuth)

The U of M Homecoming Paint the Halls Blue will promote Tiger pride and school unity. All departments, facilities, and housing on campus are strongly encouraged to participate in this event. Each participating site should be decorated in Memphis school colors according to the theme, True BOO Haunted Homecoming. Sites are encouraged to decorate as much as possible (inside, outside, or around office area) in whatever manner they see best to portray Tiger pride (streamers, window chalk, banners, lights, etc.). Faculty and students may collaborate in this event. Decorations should be displayed throughout the Homecoming celebration week. All decorations must comply with building and fire safety codes (i.e.: not blocking fire extinguishers and alarms, emergency doors, air vents, sprinkler systems, lighting fixtures, etc.)

Remember: All decorations must not block fire exits and must not be in the way of driveways/streets. Also, all windows & doors should be accessible in case of emergency. All decorations should be removed and put into their trash cans following the end of Homecoming Week - no later than Monday, November 6, 2023.

#### HOMECOMING BANNER COMPETITION

#### **Rules & Regulations:**

First, second, and third place will be designated.

Partnering teams please note: Each official partnered organization may only submit one (1) banner.

#### **Banner Requirements:**

- 1. Each team will receive a cut piece of fabric to use for their banner decorating.
- 2. All banners must pertain to the football game and Tiger spirit.
- 3. Designs will not be reviewed in advance or pre-approved.
- 4. The name of the individual or organization(s) entering the banner in the contest must be on the back of the banner.
- 5. Delivered to the Student Services Office (Wilder CU 002 no later than Friday, October 27th at 4:30 PM

#### Other Notes

- The banner shall be judged only if it meets all requirements.
- If an individual or organization wishes to keep their banner after Homecoming, it must be picked up from Wilder CU Bistro by Wednesday, November 8<sup>th</sup>, by 4:30pm. All remaining banners will be discarded.

#### **Rules & Regulations**

- 1. Organizations will be given a 11"x14" blank canvas to decorate at their discretion.
- 2. Canvases for decorating will need to be picked up by each team from the Student Services Office.
- 3. The boards must be painted in a vertical orientation.
- 4. The board should showcase your organization, as well as Memphis spirit.
- 5. All content of the Board must be appropriate. No harsh language, vulgarity, or suggestive phrases should be used. Each Board must be clearly labeled with the name or acronym of all the organizations it is representing.
- 6. Delivered to the Student Services Office (WCU 002) no later than Friday, October 27th at 4:30 PM

#### **HYPE VIDEOS**

October 20th - October 30th

To help encourage participation and help get everybody excited for the Homecoming Game, we are asking all teams to create a hype video to be posted and judged on Instagram.

All entries will be judged on the following criteria:

- Use of theme/Tiger Spirit
- Quality of entry
- Creativity/Originality
- Overall appeal
- Adherence to rules and regulations

#### Rules and regulations

- 1. Videos must be appropriate and may not include any harsh language, items, themes, or graphics.
- 2. Videos may not exceed 60 seconds in time.
- 3. Other media outlets may be used to create hype videos (TikTok etc.) but final videos must be posted on Instagram Reels.
- 4. Hype Videos must be submitted no later than October 30<sup>th</sup>, 2023, at Noon.
- 5. Video files can be sent to uml ss via direct message.

All Hype videos will be posted on the uml\_ss Instagram page for final judging. Points will be awarded as follows:

Likes - 2 points per like.

Comments- 5 points per comment

Most creative video - 100 points

Participation – 25 points
