IMPORTANT INFORMATION
<ol style="list-style-type: none"> 1. If you are unable to sit for the scheduled final exam, you may not enroll in the course. 2. A student enrolled in 6 or more credit hours may work no more than 20 hours outside the law school. 3. To be eligible for financial aid, law students must be enrolled in at least 3 law credit hours during the summer semester. 4. A student may not be enrolled in more than 9 credit hours during the summer semester. 5. Externships: Students must have successfully completed 28 credit hours to be eligible to enroll. Students will apply for and be accepted into an Externship for 2 credits (16 hours weekly), 3 credits (24 hours weekly), or 4 credits (32 hours weekly*), in addition to participating in a once-weekly seminar that will meet on Tuesdays from 4:00 p.m. to 5:30 p.m. The number of credit hours assigned to each Externship field placement is predetermined by Professor D. Schaffzin in consultation with the field placement supervisor. Credit is awarded for successful completion of both the field placement and the Externship Course seminar. Completion of the Externship Course will satisfy the Experiential Learning graduation requirement so long as a grade of Satisfactory or better is earned for the course. See Academic Regulation 16.1.C.2. An Externship may satisfy the Experiential Learning Requirement. 6. During the Summer semester, students enrolled in a 4-credit (32 weekly hours) externship may not concurrently enroll in any additional summer courses.
