Otherwise, you will have to wait until your financial aid money is released on August 17 to purchase your books using your excess financial aid money.</u>		
	If you would like to use BAPP, purchase your books online here before August 10 at 4:30 p.m., and select BAPP as your method of payment. You can pick up your books at the law school bookstore during Orientation.
