MEMORANDUM

Re: Requirements for Sports Camps

All athletics camps utilizing University of Memphis facilities are subject to the following requirements:

- For those individuals/organizations who have NOT already entered into a Facilities Use
 Agreement with the University, execution of a University facilities use agreement as well as the
 Minors on Campus amendment to the Facilities Use Agreement (attached Addendum A). The
 proof of insurance referenced in the amendment should be provided to and maintained on file
 with Athletics Compliance.
- For those individuals/organizations who have already executed a Facilities Use Agreement with the University, they should:
 - Certify the completion of background checks and sex offender registry checks for all employees and volunteers involved, including student volunteers. (see attached **Addendum** B)
 - Camp administrators should be informed that they must provide proof of comprehensive liability insurance including an appropriate amount of sexual abuse and molestation insurance, and must name the University of Memphis as an additional insured. Proof of insurance must be provided to Athletics Compliance at least seven (7) days prior to the scheduled use of University property or facilities.

Attached as **Addendum C** is a notification regarding the state law mandatory reporting requirement which can be distributed for use in satisfying the certification requirements.

As an individual or organization providing services to children and youth through the use of University of Memphis facilities, you are subject to the policies and guidelines of the University as it relates to minors on campus.
University guidelines require that all individuals who will be working with and/or providing services to children and youth must have undergone background and sex offender registry checks prior to service. Further, all individuals should be notified of their responsibilities under Tennessee state law for the mandatory reporting of child abuse or neglect.
The University further requires proof of comprehensive liability insurance. The insurance should also include coverage for sexual misconduct with limits not less than One Million Dollars (\$1,000,000) combined single limit for any one occurrence/Two Million Dollars (\$2,000,000) aggregate. The University of Memphis must be named as an additional insured. Proof of insurance must be provided to Athletics Compliance at least seven (7) days prior to the scheduled use of University property or facilities.
Certification This document should be signed by the Program Director acknowledging that background checks and sex offender registry checks have been completed on all employees and volunteers working with the program/activity and that all have been notified of their mandatory reporting responsibilities.

REPORTING RESPONSIBILITIES

Mandatory reporters of child abuse and neglect.

Tennessee Code Annotated 37-1-403(i)(1) requires all persons to report suspected cases of child abuse or neglect. "Any person who has knowledge of or is called upon to render aid to any child who is suffering from or has sustained any wound, injury, disability, or physical or mental condition, shall report such harm immediately if the harm is of such a nature as to reasonably indicated that it has been caused by brutality abuse, or neglect or that, on basis of available information, reasonably appears to have been caused by brutality, abuse, or neglect."

What to do if you suspect that a minor has been abused or neglected or is otherwise unsafe.

If you know, suspect, or receive information indicating that a minor has been abused or neglected, or if you have other concerns about a situation involving the safety of minors, follow the procedures below.

Emergencies

In case of an emergency, immediately call University of Memphis's Police Services emergency number at 901.678.HELP(4357) or 911.

• All Other Reports of Known or Suspected Abuse or Neglect of Minors

Anyone participating in a University-run or affiliated program or activity involving minors or non-University program or activity operating on campus involving minors who knows, suspects, or receives information indicating that a minor has been abused or neglected, or who has other concerns about the safety of minors MUST inform University Police Services who will determine appropriate next steps.

Anyone who knows or suspects abuse or neglect of minors may also notify the Memphis Police Department or Shelby County Sheriff's Office.
