Robert Kennedy Jr. to address U of M Law School graduates May 12



Robert F. Kennedy Jr., son of the late U.S. attorney general, will be the commencement speaker for the May 2013 graduating class of the Cecil C. Humphreys School of Law at the U of M. The ceremony will begin at 3 p.m. on Sunday, May 12, in the Cannon Center in downtown Memphis.

Kennedy is a visionary environmental business leader, lawyer and advocate. A professor of environmental law at Pace University School of Law, he also serves as

co-director of the school's Environmental Litigation Clinic. He is senior attorney for the Natural Resources Defense Council and chief prosecuting attorney for the Hudson Riverkeeper. He is also president-at-large of the Waterkeeper Alliance, a partner on the CleanTech investment team of Silicon Valley's VantagePoint Capital Ventures, the environmental adviser to Napo Pharmaceuticals and a member of the board of directors of Westinghouse Solar.

U of M will honor faculty for teaching, research and advising May 6



The U of M will honor faculty members' contributions to teaching, research and advising during an awards luncheon on May 6 beginning at noon in the UC Fountain View Suite, room 350.

The premier recognition given to a professor is the Willard R. Sparks Eminent Faculty Award. This year's recipient is Dr. Gladius Lewis, professor of mechanical engineering and an international leader in the field of orthopedic biomaterials and implant design. He will receive a crystal obelisk and a \$20,000 cash award.

Born in Sierra Leone, West Africa, Lewis earned a BS degree in mechanical engineering from the University of London, England, and a PhD in materials science from the University of Nottingham, England. Before joining the U of M in 1987, Lewis taught at Trent Polytechnic in England, the University of Zambia, the University of Zimbabwe and the University of Alabama at Huntsville. U of M Ecological Research Center improving the community in the "Ecological Age"

The Ecological Research Center (ERC) serves as a research and advisory asset to the regional community, ensuring ecologically-sound planning and development within the urban environment. The Department of Biology established the ERC in 1973 to meet the need for information relating to ecology. The objective was to provide an academic unit within the University that would foster the institution's goal of discovery and dissemination of critical knowledge to the metropolitan

community of Memphis, the people of Tennessee, the Mid-South region and the nation. Additionally, there was a desire to prepare diverse graduate and undergraduate student populations for successful careers in ecology and related fields and, in so doing, contribute to the global need for a workforce qualified to address the world's growing demand for ecological information.

More recently, the Center recognized the growing need for ecological information as it relates to increasing urban environments and addressing problematic issues in such areas. The Center established the Program in Urban Ecology, a multidisciplinary focus which trains a new breed of ecologists through graduate studies and internships. The program represents an opportunity for the University and associated groups to provide a model for others to follow worldwide as the new "Ecological Age" continues to develop.
