**Course form:** It is an online class taught remotely. All material will be available on e-courseware.

**Exams and Homework:** There will be three 100-point exams taken on line during zoom meetings. The exam with the least score will be dropped. A number of homework online assignments based on WebAssign program will be also required. The maximum points for all homework will be 100. The final exam will be comprehensive, worth of 100 points. Total points to earn = 400.
