Quizzes: 7 minute, one-question short answer quizzes taken via zoom at the end of each Thursday's class. Drop the two lowest, average to count as 15% of your grade.

Homework: Assignments will be given about once every two weeks, sometimes more frequently, never less frequently. Students should be prepared to work individually, and also in groups. This implies a willingness to develop and share ideas with the group. Students will be occasionally called upon to present their individual or group solutions to the rest of the class. This is part of the grade: how willing and able you are to discuss your work. An important aspect of this course is learning to communicate mathematically, and presentations are an important aspect of this process. Written work to turn in is expected to be neatly written, coherent, on time, and **stapled** (no loose sheets). The lowest grade will be dropped, the rest will be averaged to count 35% of your grade.

- 1 Final Exam, 20% of your grade.
