Descriptions: The primary objective of this course is to introduce the basic concepts of statistical inference. This course is about making decisions under uncertainty using statistical methods. The topics include the point estimate, confidence intervals and hypothesis testing of the population means and proportions, single and multiple linear regressions, one-way and two-way analysis of variance.

Homework: Homework problems are posed online. The homework may be collected, and may be incorporated into a quiz or exam. You need to keep up with the assignments on your own. Being unable to do homework can result in low quiz or exam grades.

Quizzes: The quizzes are open book and notes. There will be 8~10 pop-up quizzes. The best SIX quiz grades of all quizzes will comprise your total quiz grade, each worth 10 points. The quizzes problems all comes from the homework problems. Usually, you are given 15 minutes to finish the quiz in class. This is the time for you to show your homework. Make-up quizzes are NOT offered under any circumstance. Bring your calculator in each lecture in order to participate.

Examinations: There will be two in-class exams, each worth 100 points, and a comprehensive final exam worth 150 points. You may bring ONE formula sheet (called note summary) of 8 1/2" by 11" paper to each test with HANDWRITTEN notes on both sides of the page. Exams will be announced at least one week in advance. The final exam is on Thursday, May 5, 10:30am - 12:30pm.
