

Notice of Faculty Vacancy ARTIST-IN-RESIDENCE of DOUBLE BASS (classical & jazz expertise preferred)

The Rudi E. Scheidt School of Music at The University of Memphis is seeking an Artist in Residence of Double Bass beginning with the 2021-2022 academic year. Candidates with a track record of high level performing and teaching experience in both jazz and classical idioms are preferred, but candidates with outstanding credentials primarily in the classical idiom will be considered as well. Applicants must have at least a Master's degree in music. For exceptional candidates outside of the Memphis metropolitan area and the surrounding region, some virtual teaching can be explored to minimize travel. The contract is for one year, with renewal contingent upon the success of the candidate with emphasis on the areas of effective recruiting and teaching — namely maintaining a full studio which properly addresses needs in ensembles at the School of Music in terms of both quantity and quality.

The School of Music especially welcomes applications from those committed to recruiting, mentoring, and teaching students from varying backgrounds, and is dedicated to the goal of building a diverse faculty to offer our students richly varied perspectives, methods of learning, and areas of study. Individuals from all diverse backgrounds are encouraged to apply.
