General Responsibilities

- Direct and facilitate the scheduling of the School of Music's activity in the community.
- Produce and maintain engagement and recruitment itineraries and assist in the dissemination of itineraries and the communication of engagement details with students, faculty, partners, and guests as appropriate.
- Facilitate the distribution of marketing materials, media, and concert programs to community partners and presenters.
- Maintain up-to-date calendars for community events in internal systems and maintain an up-to-date database of community partners.
- Maintain and assist as necessary with the documentation and evaluation of community projects, including qualitative and quantitative data.
- Maintain current professional development and knowledge in community engagement and teaching artist best practices to seek new ways to promote the school and advance its mission and goals
- Coordinates external requests for School of Music talent
