CAPT John Bub is a native of Pulaski, TN. He enlisted in the U.S. Navy in July 1986 and served as an Electronics Technician until he was commissioned on 3 August 1996. He was commissioned through the Enlisted Commissioning Program (ECP) attending the University of Mississippi Navy ROTC unit to complete a BBA in Management. He also earned a Master's in Business Administration (MBA) in Finance from the Naval Postgraduate School (NPS).

As an enlisted sailor, John was stationed on the USS Curts (FFG 38) homeported in Long Beach, CA at first with a homeport shift to Yokosuka, Japan in 1988. After his initial sea tour, he transferred to Naval Air Station Corpus Christi, TX in the Ground Electronics Division.

As a surface warfare officer, he commanded USS Nitze (DDG 94) and Maritime Prepositioning Ships Squadron Three (MPSRON 3).

His assignments at sea include service as Main Propulsion Assistant (MPA) aboard USS Russell (DDG 59), Chief Engineer aboard USS Arleigh Burke (DDG 51), Executive Officer aboard USS Robin (MHC 54), Commanding Officer and Executive Officer aboard USS Nitze (DDG 94) and Commodore of MPSRON 3.

Ashore, John served as US Fleet Forces Command Global Force Management Action Officer, Aide-de-Camp to the Deputy Commander of U.S. European Command, Commander Second Fleet Deputy Operations Officer, Deputy Director for the Secretary of the Navy Financial Management and Budget (FMB) 2 directorate, Budget Officer for Navy Special Programs OPNAV (N9SP), Director of Operations and Training for Tactical Training Group Atlantic (TTGL), Chief of Staff and Senior Inspector at the Board of Inspection and Survey (INSURV) and Senior Assessor at Navy Safety Command.

John is currently serving as the Professor on Naval Science and Commanding Officer for the Navy Reserve Officer Training Command (NROTC) Mid-South. This command includes the NROTC Units at the University of Memphis and the University of Mississippi.

John's awards include 3 Legion of Merit Medals, a Defense Meritorious Service Medal, 4 Meritorious Service Medals, 4 Navy Commendation Medals, 5 Navy Achievement Medals and various other unit and individual awards.
