MURDERS, ROBBERIES, AND RAPES DECLINE

Based on preliminary figures from the Tennessee Bureau of Investigation (TBI) released by the University of Memphis Public Safety Institute and the Memphis Shelby Crime Commission, murders in Memphis were down 17.6 percent during the first three quarters of 2018 (January-September) compared to the same time period in 2017.

Reported robberies were down 12.4 percent, and reported rapes declined 18.2 percent.

For all of Shelby County, the declines were not quite as great, with a 14.5 percent drop in murders, an 11.3 percent decline in reported robberies, and a 16.6 percent decline in reported rapes.

"One violent crime will always be one too many, but these numbers indicate the needle is moving in favor of increased public safety," said Shelby County Dist. Atty. Gen. Amy Weirich. "My hope is that this momentum will continue and result in even better numbers by the end of the year."

"The declines are significant, even though most citizens probably don't yet feel or sense it. Violent crimes need to decline significantly more, but we are moving in the right direction so far this year," said Bill Gibbons, executive director of the UofM Public Safety Institute and president of the Crime Commission.

Reported aggravated assaults increased slightly - by 1.9 percent in Memphis and 2.8 percent countywide. Because the overall major violent crime figure is calculated by the FBI and TBI as an aggregate number of all murders, robberies, rapes and aggravated assaults combined, the sheer volume of aggravated assaults drives the overall percentage of increase or decrease. Therefore, overall major violent crime declined by a lesser percentage - 3.0 percent in Memphis and 1.8 percent countywide - than that for murders, robberies and rapes.

A promising aspect of major property crime was the drop in reported burglaries compared to last year - a 10.1 percent decline in Memphis and an 8.1 percent drop throughout the county. Motor vehicle thefts continue to be a concern, with a 12.0 percent increase in Memphis and a 15.5 percent increase countywide.

In more encouraging news, reported domestic violence incidents continued to decline compared to last year, with a drop of 11.1 percent in Memphis and 9.8 percent in all of Shelby County.


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About the Crime Statistics: In measuring overall crime rates and trends, the Memphis Shelby Crime Commission and the Public Safety Institute use data reported by local enforcement agencies to the Tennessee Incident Based Reporting System (TIBRS), which was developed and is maintained by the Tennessee Bureau of Investigation. An incident is defined in TIBRS as "one or more offenses committed by the same offender, or group of offenders acting in concert, at the same time and place." Reported major violent crime and domestic violence offenses, however, uniquely refer to a victim count versus an incident count. All rates are calculated based on per 100,000 population.










