### **Additional notes regarding submissions:**

1. Submissions for presentations and posters are limited to research that the principal investigator completed while an undergraduate student.
2. If the research is co-authored by a graduate student or faculty member, the undergraduate student must be the first author, as described in the latest edition of the APA Publication Manual. The undergraduate student must also be the presenter.
3. All abstracts will undergo a review by a panel of faculty reviewers that make judgments based on research methodology and relevance to the field.
4. Literature reviews that do not include empirical data collection and/or analysis will not be accepted.
5. The title and author(s) of your abstract will appear EXACTLY as they are entered on the submission form. Please double check punctuation and spelling before submitting.
6. Students are expected to work with a faculty mentor to ensure that the abstract and subsequent presentation is professionally written.
7. Everyone attending the conference, including each presenter, must register and pay the appropriate registration fee. Registration prior to the day of the conference entitles you to attend all conference events, including lunch.
8. The submitter accepts the responsibility to assure that the presentation is made. If an unexpected event prevents an author from presenting, the submitter is responsible for finding an alternate presenter.

### **Presentation Guidelines**

#### **Poster Guidelines**

- Posters must be freestanding, with maximum dimensions of 4'x4'.
- Include a heading at the top with the poster title, author(s), and school affiliation.
- Be prepared for friendly questions about your research.
- This is a formal event; professional attire and behavior are expected.
- Consult your faculty advisor for guidance on assembling a poster.

#### **Oral Paper Guidelines**

- Oral paper presenters will have 15 minutes to present their work.
- Be prepared for friendly questions about your work.
- Projection equipment will be available for your presentation.
- This is a formal event; professional attire and behavior are expected.
