The purpose of this doctoral seminar is to provide an overview of research design and research methods in health services research. This course provides a comprehensive introduction to research process, including conceptualization of a research study, research design of methods and measures, data collection, data analysis, and guidelines for writing and presenting results in health services research. Special emphasis will be given on understanding different study designs, including experimental and quasi-experimental study designs, understanding the strengths and weaknesses of each design, and underlying logic of different procedures for obtaining empirical evidence for rigorous health services research.
