ABOUT THE PROGRAM

A Master of Public Health (MPH) provides a strong foundation in the principles and practices of public health through the lens of social and behavioral sciences. This CEPH-accredited MPH program's mission is to provide a stimulating academic environment in a metropolitan setting that supports excellence and innovation in education, research and service to enhance the lives and health of individuals, families and communities in the Mid-South and beyond.

The MPH-SBS degree can be earned either in-person, online or hybrid, either full-time or part-time. Students are eligible to take the CPH exam upon completion of their MPH core courses.

The Master of Public Health (MPH) program offers two options for students:

- 1. Traditional four-semester program offered in-person or online
- 2. An accelerated program available for completion within 12 to 15 months

WHAT YOU WILL LEARN

Students work closely with professors and peers to develop competence in the principles of social and behavioral sciences as they apply to public health issues. The curriculum includes explorations of the social and community factors involved in public health problems, qualitative and mixed-methods research and evidence-based intervention strategies. Graduates will gain experience in project management and evaluation, as well as public health communication.
