





Call for Proposals

The Division of Research & Innovation is pleased to announce the 2024-2025 Fine Arts, Humanities and Social Sciences (FAHSS) Support Program to encourage the growth of externally funded research through the production of scholarly and creative works. This program provides funding in the following categories:

- · Professional Indexing Grant
- Image Reproduction Fund
- Subvention Grant
- · Field Work and Archival Research Grant

You may apply to any category of funding using the same application requirements below. The maximum allowable award in any category is \$2,500.

Submission Documents

Submission materials include the following:

- CV (maximum of five pages)
- Description of the scholarly work or research activity being produced as a result of funding (two pages or less)
 - For indexing, image reproduction and subvention grants please include details on the published work that will be supported with this work. If a contract or other documentation is available and may be submitted, include as an appendix (appendices do contribute to the page count)
- A summary plan for pursuing external funding including any granting agencies, foundations or other sources of funding you plan to pursue as a result of this work's publication. Including specific grants, you will apply to (one page or less).
- A brief budget narrative for your planned expenditure (one page or less)
 - If a quote for costs from a publisher is available, please include this as an appendix document.

Submission

All applications will be submitted through <u>InfoReady</u> (UofM log-in required). Applications will be accepted through Friday, Feb. 28, at 5 p.m. CT.

Award Decisions

Awards will be announced in March and the period of performance will extend for one year.


