



Gerontology/Positive Aging Research Initiative

To inform the community about current aging research initiatives in Memphis, gather feedback and discuss how research can better address the needs of older adults — while supporting the development of age-friendly communities in Memphis, Shelby County, the Delta Region and beyond.

Background: As populations around the world age, we are presented with a powerful opportunity to reshape how we experience and think about growing older — one that embraces the diversity, value and contributions of older adults in society.

In Memphis and across the greater Delta region, the number of residents aged 65 and older has steadily increased, even as the overall population declines. This demographic shift — driven by out-migration of younger populations, lower birth rates, and increased life expectancy — highlights an urgent need to invest in research, policies and services that support positive aging.

Key components of healthy aging initiatives span a broad range of focus areas: equitable access to healthcare, financial stability, affordable and accessible housing, reliable transportation, social inclusion and age-friendly environments. Together, these elements support not only improved quality of life for older adults, but also help combat ageism and promote dignity in aging.

Meeting these challenges requires interdisciplinary collaboration — both within academia and across sectors — grounded in a forward-thinking and inclusive vision of aging as a vital and dynamic stage of life.

Research Lead: Dr. Kallol Bhattacharyya, assistant professor in the Division of Health Systems Management and Policy and a Health Economist in the Center for Public Health Informatics, Data, Equity, Analytics and Systems at the University of Memphis School of Public Health.

Town Hall Topics for Discussion:

- Overview of key areas of research: understanding the biology of aging, investigating the impact of agerelated diseases (e.g., Alzheimer's and dementia), promoting healthy lifestyle choices, developing interventions, addressing socioeconomic factors and social determinants of health, translating research into practice.
- Discussing interdisciplinary opportunities: public health, developmental psychology, clinical psychology, mental health, health sciences, neuropsychological rehabilitation, medicine, nursing, sociology, anthropology, social policy, social work and economics in advancing aging research and enhancing community partnerships.
- Current gerontology funding opportunities and initiatives spanning local, state, national and international domains.
- Stakeholder mapping, resources, partnerships and strategic planning that will support the University of Memphis in becoming a leader in age-friendly research.
