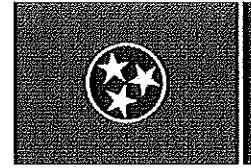


Sex Offenders List

An Act to require the link to the State of Tennessee Sexual Offender Registry be updated on the university website; to require that all employees of The University of Memphis Police Department be able to identify the physical copy of the State of Tennessee Sexual Offender Registry and present it on request.

WHEREAS, University of Memphis police will be notified when an individual who is registered in Tennessee as a sex offender enrolls as a student or begins work as a volunteer on the campus. The Tennessee Bureau of Investigation (TBI) is responsible for notifying the University police. Registered sex offenders have ten (10) days to notify TBI by completing a TBI Sexual Offender Registration/Monitoring Form and having it delivered to TBI.

WHEREAS, The link to the State of Tennessee Sexual Offender Registry on the university website is out of date

WHEREAS, The list of registered sex offenders is available for viewing 24 hours a day, every day (including holidays and weekends)

WHEREAS, All employees of The University of Memphis Police Department are not aware of where the list of sexual offenders is located

THEREFORE, BE IT ENACTED BY THE 68th General Assembly OF THE STUDENT GOVERNMENT ASSOCIATION:

Section 1: The University of Memphis website will be updated to include the correct link the State of Tennessee Bureau of Investigation (TBI)

Section 2: The link will be checked and updated at the beginning of every semester

Section 3: Employees will be made aware of where the physical copy is located during training and be able to accurately answer any questions that students may have on the university's policy and how communication is conveyed through TBI and The University of Memphis.

Section 4: Efforts will begin immediately after passage of this bill and will be completely in place at the beginning of the spring semester of 2018
