Historical trauma is the cumulative physical, emotional, spiritual, and psychological wounding of groups of people. Systematic violence and oppression has been shared by collective groups of people who experience it in many forms and the impact can be transmitted over generations.

Dr. Washington will enhance participant understanding of how trauma that occurred generations ago may continue to have societal and personal impacts today. This information is critical to enhance knowledge, skills, and services when working with vulnerable populations. Having an understanding of historical trauma will assist professionals to understand the unique needs of victims of trauma.
